3 10A NCAC 39C.0104 CLARIFICATION OF THE DEFINITION OF ENCLOSED AREA

- 4 (a) An area is enclosed if it has (1) a roof or other overhead covering and (2) permanent or temporary walls
- 5 or side coverings on three or more sides that make up 55 percent or more of the total combined perimeter
- 6 <u>surface area.</u>
- 7 (b) A roof, overhead covering, wall or side covering includes any permanent or temporary physical barrier
- 8 or retractable divider. Examples of materials for a roof, overhead covering, wall or side covering include
- 9 wood, metal, canvas, tarp, cloth, glass, tent material, plastic, vinyl sheeting, fabric shades, lattice, awning
- 10 material, polyurethane sheeting or any other similar material. Walls or side coverings do not include mesh
- 11 screening which is 0.011 gauge with an 18 by 16 mesh count or more open mesh size.
- 12 (c) An opening means a door, a window or any other aperture that is open to the outdoors.
- 13 (d) If the openings in an unenclosed area are covered, such that the area at that time meets the definition of
- 14 <u>being enclosed pursuant to paragraph (a)</u>, then smoking must be prohibited in the area while the openings
- 15 <u>are so covered.</u>
- 16 (e) If windows or doors form any part of the partition between an enclosed area and an unenclosed area
- 17 that is used for smoking, these openings shall be closed at all times during the operation of the
- 18 <u>establishment except for ingress and egress to prevent migration of smoke into the enclosed area.</u>
- 19 (f) Nothing in this rule prohibits a restaurant or bar owner from making an unenclosed area smoke-free.
