RE: Notification of Proposed Rule Readoption: 15A NCAC 18A .1511

Pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.2, this memorandum serves as the required notice to interested persons that the Commission for Public Health (CPH) is proposing to readopt rule 15A NCAC 18A .1511, regarding the sanitation of water supplies in local confinement facilities, with updates to clarify existing language and align with current practices. CPH has submitted notice of its intent to readopt this rule to the NC Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH).

In accordance with G.S. 150B-21.4 and G.S. 150B-21.3A(d)(2), the NC Office of State Budget and Management determined that no fiscal note is required for this rule readoption, as all changes either impose a less stringent burden on regulated persons or have no impact on state or local governments and no substantial economic impact.

Procedure for Subjecting a Proposed Rule to Legislative Review: If an objection is not resolved prior to the adoption of the rule, a person may also submit written objections to the Rules Review Commission after the adoption of the Rule. If the Rules Review Commission receives written and signed objections after the adoption of the Rule in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.3(b2) from 10 or more persons clearly requesting review by the legislature and the Rules Review Commission approves the rule, the rule will become effective as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1). The Commission will receive written objections until 5:00 p.m. on the day following the day the Commission approves the rule. The Commission will receive those objections by mail, delivery service, hand delivery, or facsimile transmission. SUBCHAPTER 18A - SANITATION

SECTION .1500 - SANITATION OF LOCAL CONFINEMENT FACILITIES

15A NCAC 18A .1511 WATER SUPPLY

- (a) Water supplies <u>at local confinement facilities</u> shall meet the requirements in <u>15A NCAC 18C or</u> 15A NCAC 18A <u>.1700</u>. <u>.1700</u>, <u>as applicable</u>.
- (b) In local confinement facilities that use a non-community water supply, as defined at G.S. 130A-313(10), a sample of water shall be collected by the Department of Health and Human Services At least once a year, year and submitted to the North Carolina State Laboratory of Public Health or other laboratory certified by the North Carolina State Laboratory of Public Health under 10A NCAC 41C .0102 a sample of water shall be collected by the Department and submitted to the Division of Laboratory Services or other laboratory certified by the Department to perform bacteriological examinations.
- (c) No backflow connections or cross connections with unapproved water supplies shall exist. A local confinement facility's water supply plumbing shall not include cross-connections as set out in 15A NCAC 18C .0102(c)(8).
- (d) Hot water heating facilities shall be provided. Hot and cold running water under pressure shall be provided to food preparation areas, and any other areas in which water is required for cleaning. Local confinement facilities shall provide water heating facilities. Hot and cold running water under pressure shall be provided to carry out all operations.
